Taylor Fork Surface Hoar and Facets

Date Mon, 01/09/2023 - 14:25 Activity Snowmobiling

There was 4 inches of new snow in Taylor Fork, and there was wind drifting in several places. We rode to the wilderness boundary to dig a pit. We were on a south <u>aspect</u> at 8,800'. HS 125cm (~4 feet), ECTN5 on <u>surface hoar</u> under the new snow, ECTN21 on facets 1.5 feet below the surface, ECTN 28 on facets near the ground. We rode past the Otter <u>Slide</u> to dig on a north facing <u>aspect</u>, and we had an ECTP5 on buried <u>surface hoar</u>. There was 6" of new snow on top of the <u>surface hoar</u> layer that propagated. While leaving Taylor Fork this afternoon it was beginning to snow. The additional snow in the forecast will likely make this <u>surface hoar</u> layer more reactive now that it is buried. Additionally, the poor structure throughout Taylor Fork could make the deeper weak layers more reactive.
