Avalanche photos from Sheep Creek

There were large <u>slab</u> avalanches that happened on both sides of the valley. Northerly and southerly aspects.

I was particularly impressed by the width of one of the slides Nate observed yesterday. (one of the 2 photos attached). That <u>slide</u> in the photo looked to be an average of about 2-4' deep (6' deep in places) and about 800-1000' wide, spanning across lots of different terrain features.

I also noticed that the main south facing <u>slide</u> path off of Miller Mountain avalanched very large as well. (the same <u>avalanche path</u> where the snowbiker was killed last winter) I couldn't see the crown, but the debris ran to the valley bottom and appears to have flattened a large stand of mature timber.

VERY windy out there today. Primarily SWerly, but blowing in all directions and moving LOTS of snow. Natural avalanches likely happening today.
